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INTRODUCTION

What began for my wife, Susie, and I, Todd, as a call to prayer, so we began meeting every Thursday for a time of fellowship and prayer with one other person. So what we did for over a year with another member of our team led us to believe that we are called to plant churches. Our third team member has since suffered a stroke and is currently in a nursing home. Yet, the call and vision remains and Susie and I are still seeking the Lord together in prayer on Thursday evenings.

We had been praying specifically for God to show us the best way to reach our community in evangelism. I found a book in a thrift store called "Church Planting for a Greater Harvest" by C. Peter Wagner. He stated in the book, "The single most effective evangelistic methodology under heaven is planting new churches." I got another book called, "Planting Missional Churches" by Ed Stetzer and Daniel Im, which stated the exact same thing.

Another thing that was happening at the same time was that we were running a discipleship group. Within that group we found out that we could join another ministry in making meals for the homeless on the weekends. In stepping out in that and with our prayer meetings we started to see a clearer picture of what God was leading us to do. We then started to have church services every Sunday morning at one of the parks that we had been going to, to hand out meals to the homeless, of which we are still doing.

So, through much prayer and confirmations of the Lord along the way, primarily but not exclusively were many financial contributions, which was enough for us to buy an enclosed trailer, chairs, an amp and some microphones, Bibles, tables, and a large coffee pot and some carafes, this is what we believe we are called to and are being led to do:

We are being called to be church planters that has a primary focus on discipleship and outreach, to the homeless and in a poorer area of town, which will raise up future leaders to do the same thing. Basically what we are being called to do is all of the things that Jesus did and taught

to His disciples and to follow the Biblical examples in the book of Acts to plant churches. Most of those "churches" that I speak of planting may not be traditional churches with a building-and-a-steeple-kind-of-thing but in parks, homes, or wherever else the Lord leads us. We do intend though to be looking for a home church to plant that is a building to where we could have quarterly get togethers with all of the daughter churches and then also as a main hub for our activities. It would also serve as a fully functioning church as well, in the Lord's time, as the Lord provides the people and the resources. Also of much importance to note is that as we are called to be one in Christ, as to operate more fully as the body of Christ, which means to us that we intend to work with other Christians irregardless of their denominational affiliation, as long as it doesn't compromise the gospel of Jesus Christ. There are many details that we don't know yet, but we do wholeheartedly believe that what we have so far is from God Himself, and though this calling goes way beyond our own aspirations or desires, or abilities, we know that with God all things are possible and that as we put our trust in Him to determine our steps He will show us, and others, that He indeed is the Lord!

VISION

As we had recognized the call to do the works of Christ, what we came up with in prayer, meditations, and the studying of the Word of God is the name of our ministry to be called One in Christ Mission, which comes from John 17:21, in Jesus' prayer to the Father, "that they all may be one, as You, Father, are in Me, and I in You; that they also may be one in Us, that the world may believe that You sent Me." The following then is our **Vision Statement**:

One in Christ Mission seeks to fulfill the vision of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior, which is the will of God the Father, to build His kingdom for His glory, honor and praise by being disciples of Christ and operating as the body of Christ.

The **catchphrase** that we will be using is:

One in Christ Mission
"That the world may believe"
(John 17:21)

With the simplified Vision being:

**One in Christ Mission is to be disciples
of Christ and operate as the body of Christ.**

Further expanded for a bigger picture, as Jesus spoke it, and is recorded in the book of John, is what we are calling the **Vision of Christ**:

Have Eternal Life in Christ (John 17:3 NKJV)

"And this is eternal life, that they may know You, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom You have sent."

[Also John 3:16]

Be Sanctified in Christ (John 17:19 NKJV)

"And for their sakes I sanctify Myself, that they also may be sanctified by the truth." [Also Hebrews 10:14]

Be a Friend of Christ (John 15:14 NKJV)

"You are My friends if you do whatever I command you."

[Also 1 John 1:3]

Love as Christ Loves (John 13:35 NKJV)

"By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another." [Also Matthew 22:37-39]

Be Where Christ is (John 12:26 NKJV)

"If anyone serves Me, let him follow Me; and where I am, there My servant will be also. If anyone serves Me, him My Father will honor." [Also Matthew 25:35-36]

Do the Work of Christ (John 14:12 NKJV)

"Most assuredly, I say to you, he who believes in Me, the works that I do he will do also; and greater works than these he will do, because I go to My Father."

[Also Mark 16:15-18]

Bear Much Fruit in Christ (John 15:8 NKJV)

"By this My Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit; so you will be My disciples." [Also Matthew 4:19]

After all, as Jesus Christ is our Lord and Savior, our Great Shepherd, we are to look to Him to lead us and guide us by His Holy Spirit and in His Word.

MISSION

Our **Mission Statement** is in collaboration with the IPHC and Alpha Conference mission statements, of which we are affiliated, with some additions to match our vision:

Our mission is to build the kingdom of God and to disciple believers through worship, fellowship, evangelism, and the preaching and teaching of the Word of God in obedience to the Great Commission, and to develop leaders and multiply churches, and to work with others within the community when possible to accomplish it all for the edification of the body of Christ and for the glory of God.

CORE VALUES

As the conference we are affiliated with (Alpha Conference within the IPHC) each has their set of Core Values. We came up with a list for this ministry as well. Our core values are arranged in alphabetical order so as to say that they are all important, and not to say one is more important than the other. Not only is each one important but they are all very much necessary:

METHOD OF OUTREACH

- Church services in the parks.
- Inviting the homeless to our services when we go the camps to give them food, clothing, etc.
- Hand out business cards to whoever will take one.
- Keep posting updates on our website and on Facebook.
- Other outdoor events in the parks such as music events.
- Join other events and ministries.
- Will walk through nearby neighborhoods and invite persons. to our services and try to engage them in dialogue.

FOLLOWUP

- We will making Connection/Prayer Request Cards. We will be explaining that the cards will allow us to be praying specifically for them through the week as well as any prayer needs that are specified.
- While the ministry is small, we will look to get people helping in the ministry in setting up, serving, and in doing outreach through the park before and after the service.
- Continue to follow-up with our feeding the meals to the homeless on Saturdays.
- Will send out invitations to services and events through Connections Card info as well as inviting through personal contacts.

TARGET GROUP

- Ministry to the homeless at camps and at parks
- Also look at ways to reach those people in poorer areas that are just getting by
- While ministry teams will consist of mostly persons who want to be part of ministry in reaching the poor with the Gospel, it may include some homeless people as well
- Eventually also we'll be wanting to include a nursing home or two to hold services at, as well as doing follow-up visitations

PROCESS OF DISCIPLESHIP

- Starting out, our discipleship is in ministering with the homeless when we are handing out meals and having services at the park
- Eventually, in God's time we will be looking for a building where we can have discipleship training classes

which would include gifts testing and the Spiritual Disciplines and would include being part of the outreach ministry.

- We will also be wanting to have transportation so that we can pick up people for our classes that will be at the mother church or at a church that we can use their facilities.

CHURCH PLANTING MODEL

- Our church planting model is missional/incarnational. As we develop relationships with those that we minister with, we anticipate a church to develop as we already have one developing through our church services at the park.
- As described by others, our ministry is more spiritual than strategic, more about prayer than planning, and more spontaneous than organized.
- Nevertheless, we have organizational gifting in our present group and we do have a plan for the Lord to enlarge our territory into multisite plants.
- Our focus is certainly more about prayer and relationships than in promotion and hype.

TEAM MEMBERS & STAFF NUMBERS

- We have found out already that there is no limit to how many we can use for our team to help in setting up and breaking down for our services and then to minister to the people after the services.
- The number of leaders, staff, and positions will be dependent on how many daughter churches we have operating since there will need to be a team leader at each location, as well as other positions such as the worship team, greeters, food tables, etc.
- For the eventual building church we will be looking for an administrator, a financial person, a groundskeeper, and two or more clergy.
- Follow-up lay pastors/clergy as well as visitation clergy for hospitals and nursing homes would also be needed.

FUNDING

- God has been providing funding just by word of mouth. Just telling people about our ministry or them hearing about it from others has brought more than enough funding so far. Once we get closer to occupying a building and paying some

- of the staff, we will obviously be needing more significant and regular funding to pay all the bills.
- We will be soon implementing a way for people to give/tithe electronically and we will start having a tithe/offering box at our services.
 - We will also have a way to give through our website, oneinchristmission.com and through our Facebook page
 - One more thing to note about funding, we cannot get tax exempt status unless we have an actual building with an address and where regular services are held. That is one reason of many of why we want to find a building as soon as possible.

3. Leadership Retreat - Take your key leaders for a time of prayer, thanksgiving, re-envisioning, goal-setting and planning with the following Landmarks in mind. Leaders need to step back and look at the big picture. Often we can't see the forest because of the trees. A special inter- personal dynamic comes when leaders "live" together for a few days.

4. Process of Discipleship Review -Study how God is bringing people to your church and review the Process of Ministry originally envisioned in Phase 1. Readjust your plans to make sure people are being effectively evangel- ized, followed-up, folded into the church, and discipled. Perhaps do this at your leadership retreat. Do it as a team—so everyone is on board and works toward the goals.

5. Jerusalem Outreach Plan - Develop a new outreach plan for the next 12 months to make sure you are continuing to penetrate your community with the gospel. Evaluate what has worked well and consider doing it again. Eliminate strategies that are not working! Perhaps an inventory or survey of your congregation would help you to make a realistic assessment of what has been working.

6. Judea Outreach Plan - Begin to plan for giving birth to a

daughter congregation in your "Judea" to reach people who are out of range for your church. It may seem like a stretch, but you can at least partner with others who may be spearheading a church plant. Later on you can be the "mother church" if you are not ready to spearhead the effort. Remember your church DNA— and make sure being a church planting church is part of it, right from the start.

7. Samaria Outreach Plan - Look at your area from cross-cultural perspective. Are you reaching out to other cultures? Plan steps to reach your Samaria, including the possibility of helping to plant a church of another culture nearby.
8. Worldwide Missions Outreach Plan - Make sure your church has a global impact by investing in church planting around the world. Begin a plan to highlight world-wide missions in your church and to raise up missionaries from within your congregation (Acts 13:1-3). Healthy churches develop a worldwide vision. As a new church you probably cannot do a lot, but you can sow the seeds that will eventually grow into a worldwide harvest.
